Join UWTV in our Kane Hall studio for several presentations from Sony representatives on Tuesday, Sept. 29. Explore tapeless workflow options, watch camera demonstrations and check out new digital signage solutions. Attendees will also have a chance to win a Sony Blu-Ray HD player.

Try out pan/tilt/ zoom cameras and a remote camera operating switcher ideal for distance learning environments. See how new video/data projectors and digital signage systems are being used in classroom settings as well as emergency alert systems.
